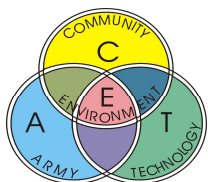

All papers will be reviewed by two independent reviewers. The authors are responsible for the content and language level of their papers. All accepted papers will be published in printed and CD conference proceedings. The authors of the accepted papers are responsible for their paper presentation at the conference. The time allotted for one speech is 15 minutes, including time for discussion.

Abstract and proceedings conference guidelines:

General instruction:

Type area:

The text should fit exactly into the type area of 160 × 247 mm (6.30" × 9.72"). For correct settings use A4 size and margins 25 mm (0,98") all around.

Main text, typefont, typesize and spacing:

The main text should be structured into chapters, sub-chapters and chapter parts. Chapters should be numbered.

Use Times New Roman 12 point size and 13 point line spacing (Standard; text tag). Use roman type except for the tables, figures, diagrams, and graphs description, parameters in mathematics (not for log, sin, cos, ln, max., d (in dx), etc), Latin names of species and genera in botany and zoology and the titles of journals and books which should all be in italics.

Never use bold, except to denote vectors in mathematics. Never underline any text. Never add any space between lines or paragraphs and never use letterspacing.

First lines of paragraphs are indented 10 mm (0.39").

Tables, figures, diagrams and graphs should be numbered and labeled. Label is written in italic and centered below figures, diagrams and graphs and above tables. Refer to tables, figures diagrams and graphs by these numbers.

Use the equation editor of the selected word processing programme. Equations are not indented. Number equations consecutively and place the number with the tab key at the end of the line, between parentheses. Refer to equations by these numbers.
